
Another of the invocations of the order is Hizb al-Bahr [The Litany of the Sea], by the perfected Pole, Sheikh Abul Hasan al-

The sheikh (Allah be well pleased with him) said of it, "Whoever recites our invocation shall have what we do, and bear what we bear."
